
FOR STUDENTS OF CLASSES 1,2 & 3 PICOFES: PRIME MINISTERS & Dy PMs



This three page picture album shows pictures of 12 Indian Prime Ministers and Deputy Prime Ministers, including the current PM.

- 1) <u>NARENDRA MODI</u>: The current PM of India. He got re-elected in May 2019. He is from Gujarat. His current tenure ends this June.
- 2) INDIRA GANDHI: She was the first woman PM of India. She is the daughter of India's first PM Jawaharlal Nehru.
- 3) <u>MANMOHAN SINGH</u>: He was the PM before Narendra Modi. He is from Punjab and he belongs to the Congress Party.
- 4) **LK ADVANI**: A senior leader of BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party), he was the Deputy Prime Minister of India from 2002 to 2004.

- 1) <u>VP SINGH</u>: He was the Prime Minister of India from 1989 to 1990. His party was the Janata Dal. He defeated Rajiv Gandhi, a very popular PM of those days, in the elections held in 1989.
- 2) <u>DEVE GOWDA</u>: He was the PM of India for a brief period from 1994 to 1997. He was the 11th person to be the Prime Minister of India. His native state is Karnataka.
- 3) J NEHRU: He was the longest serving PM of India. From the independence in 1947, he was PM till his death in 1964.
- 4) AB VAJPAYEE: He was the first person from BJP to become India's PM. He was the PM of India on three different occasions.

- 1) <u>DEVI LAL</u>: He is from the state of Haryana. Though he was never the PM of India, he served as the Deputy Prime Minister for three years from 1989 to 1991.
- 2) <u>CHANDRASEKHAR</u>: He was the 8th PM of India. He served in this capacity for a very short time only, from 1990 to 1991.
- 3) JAGJIVAN RAM: He is called affectionately as Babuji and was the Deputy Prime Minister of India from 1977 to 1979.
- 4) <u>GL NANDA</u>: Gulzari Lal Nanda was the acting PM of India on two occasions first time when PM Nehru died and the second time when PM Lal Bahadur Shastri died.

- 1) <u>CALF</u>: Calf is a name given to the young of many vegetarian animals like the cow. You see a cow and its calf in this picture.
- 2) <u>CUB LION</u>: Cub is the name of the young of many hunting animals. This cutie looks like a kitten but is actually a lion cub.
- 3) <u>FRY</u>: Young ones of fish are called fry. This picture shows a guppy fish mother (centre) surrounded by many of its tiny fry.
- **4) FOAL**: Foal is the name given to the young one of a horse. Most foals are very playful & just jump around.




- 1) <u>SUNIL</u>: Sunil Chhetri was an Indian football player. He has scored many goals in International football. He retired in 2024.


IPS: IPS is the short name of Indian Police Service, an esteemed civil service.


ISA: It is the short name for International Seabed office tools software Authority.

- 1) <u>ABDUL KALAM</u>: He was a scientist who became India's president. He is loved by all and is called People's President.
- 2) **DONALD TRUMP**: He was a president of USA (2016-2020).
- 3) <u>BUDDHA</u>: His teachings led to the foundation of Buddhism, one of the biggest religions in the world. Buddhism is the chief religion of China, the 2nd most populated country in the world.
- 4) <u>NEHRU</u>: He was the first Prime Minister of India. He was a leader who was much adored by children who affectionately called him Chacha (meaning Uncle).

PICOFES: FAMOUS PERSONS' SILHOUETTES




- 1) **NEERAJ**: Neeraj Chopra is India's topmost javelin thrower. He won gold in the Tokyo Olympics (2020), and many other medals.
- 2) MS DHONI: He was a captain of the Chennai Super Kings cricket team. He is also the most successful Indian wicket keeper of all time. He hails from the state of Jharkhand. His native city is Ranchi, Jharkhand's capital.
- 3) **GANDHI**: He is called the Father of the Nation. He led the fight for India's independence from the British.
- **4) BOSE**: His full name is Subhas Chandra Bose. He established an army to fight for India's independence. He is also called Netaji, meaning 'The Leader.'



Pictures of different food dishes, mostly from S.India

- 1) Pie: Made of meat, fish, fruit or vegetable, baked & kept inside pastry. Pastry is made with flour and water.
- 2) Podi dosa: Dosa is made with rice flour and black gram. Onion (vengaiyam) and masala (podi) is added to the dosa called vengaiya podi dosa
- 3) Puttu: Puttu or pittu is made with ground rice & coconut which is steamed before eating. If made with Ragi, it is called kelvaragu puttu. Puttu is very popular in Kerala.
- 4) Meals: Non-vegetarian meals are made by cooking other edible animals. Chicken, mutton, fish, crab, prawn- examples.





1)Egg: Egg is very nutritious and is eaten after being boiled or fried, sometimes raw. Boiled eggs are used widely in dishes.

- 2) Omelette: Omelette is made with egg. Eggs are beaten and then fried in a pan. Some flavours can also be added.
- 3) Upma: Upma is native to South India. It is made with rice flour and roasted wheat. It is either slightly slimy or dry.
- 4) Chicken biryani: Biryani cooked with chicken meat is chicken biryani. It is very delicious and is generally consumed with raita and/or some gravy.



- 1) Bun: A small soft round sweet bread or cake with dried fruits is called bun. Some buns are very spongy and soft.
- 2) Biscuits: Biscuits are small and baked unleavened cake. They are very crispy in nature and are normally flat.
- 3) Prawn Fry: Eraa is called prawn in English. The dish made by frying small prawns is kutti eraa varuval. It is spicy.
- 4) Pitta: Pitta bread looks like chapati. It is a yeast-leavened bread made with wheat flour. It undergoes stuffing with vegetarian or non-veg items before being eaten.



- 1) Idli: Idli is among the best breakfast items in the world. It is made with rice batter which is used for making dosa also.
- 2) Jelly: Jelly is soft and elastic in nature. It is somewhat transparent and many children like it. It is often eaten cold.
- 3) Puri: Puri is a flat wheat bread fried in oil & eaten with either gravy or vegetables. It is preferred during breakfast.
- 4) Kale: It is a variety of cabbage which is hard. Its leaves are used as vegetable in cooking. Some people also eat it raw, saying that the nutrients may get spoiled while cooking.



- 1) Aappam/Egg Gravy: Aapam is a pancake made with fermented rice. It can be eaten with coconut milk of guruma. The picture here shows muttai guruma.
- 2) Pasta: Pasta is a dish native to Italy but eaten worldwide. It is made with wheat & water. It is cooked in boiling water. There are several different varieties of pasta.
- 3) Bran: Grain husk that separated from flour after milling is bran. It is rich in fibre. Bran flakes are also available.
- 4) Chapati: Chapati is also called roti & is more commonly eaten in North India. Chapati is made from wheat.



- 1) Potato Boiled: Potatoes are boiled and then cooked with some masala to give taste. Eaten as an accompaniment.
- 2) Parota: It is popular in South India and Sri Lanka. It is made from maida flour, and is not good for regular eating.
- 3) Curd Rice: Curd rice is known as bagala bath. It tastes better when carrot, pomegranate etc are added.
- 4) Bread: Flour, water & yeast are mixed together & baked to get bread. It is generally eaten with jam and butter.









- 1) Atta maker: Used to prepare dough for chapati or puri. It mixes the mixtrure of wheat flour, water and salt finely.
- 2) Needle: It is used to stitch clothes. It can be used manually or in the sewing machines for stitching purposes.
- 3) Spindle: It is used to roll yarn around it. It can be made of wood or metal & is mostly cylinderical with thicker sides.
- **4) Gas cylinder**: It is used to store gas, mainly cooking gas. Cylinders are used carefully to avoid fire accidents.



- 4) Yardstick: Yardstick is a measuring stick used for finding lengths of objects. Yardstick is usually three feet long.


SILHOUETTES

Silhouettes are shadow images of objects or people. This issue has six pages of silhouettes on three topics - fruits, stationery and cartoons. Let us start with fruits.




MANGO

Mango is the national fruit of India. This fruit is very sweet and is available mostly in the summer season only.




APRICOT

KIWI


Chinese gooseberry and is a native of China. It is brown on the outside & green inside.




BANANA


GRAPES

Apple is the most cultivated fruit in the world. It does not grow in hot regions. However, it is grown in most of the colder countries around the world.






CHERRY


Cherry is a small red fruit that grows on a tree. The seed of cherry fruit is a single seed. It is a hard, stone like seed found at the centre of the fruit.





PEN

Folders are used for keeping important documents for later use. A folder may also be called a file. Many files are needed in big offices to store documents.






CALCULATOR


It is a device which helps us do calculations easily. But children like you must do your calculations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division) by yourselves.


PENCIL

Markers are pens which have very thick nibs and so are used for writing in big size. This picture shows a bright coloured (fluorescent) marker pen.






SCISSORS


SHREK


Beauty and the Beast is a story which was made very popular by its cartoon movie version, released by Walt Disney studios.




PETER PAN
